### What are these "Conversations?"

Using ceremony and council, Conversations in the Midst of Life & Nature offers an opportunity for women of all ages to gather in natural settings to share about their lives and what's important to them. Conversations provide a sacred space to be witnessed with respect, compassion, deep listening, acceptance of self and others, and confidentiality.

### What will we talk about?

Each Conversation has its own theme. This one is focused on the sacred cycle of Gratitude and Giveaway.

### What shall I bring?

- A giveaway from your garden harvest, kitchen or pantry (this could be anything from fresh fall flowers to baked goods to zucchini—whatever you would like to share for others to receive and take home)

### How do I get there?

- Take Interstate 84 to Exit 22 for Corbett
- Turn right at the end of the ramp onto Corbett Hill Road
- Follow Corbett Hill Road to the top of the hill where the road splits. Take the LEFT fork onto Columbia River Historic Highway/Highway 30
- Stay on the highway for 2 miles
- Just past the Portland Women's Forum on the left, the road splits again. Take the RIGHT fork onto Larch Mountain Road.
- Go 2 miles to milepost "2", followed by sharp left curve with cautionary signs
- At the end of the curve, make a sharp right on a gravel driveway and follow the 1/4 driveway to the parking area

If you want to carpool with others, please reply all and say whether you have a ride to offer or you need a ride. Include your contact details so you can arrange your own rides.

We welcome women of all ages and walks of life who are interested in exploring, through conversations with other women, our individual and shared wisdom; our ideas and dreams; our personal consciousness; our strength in uncertain times; and our willingness to develop alliances with each other in honoring communities.
